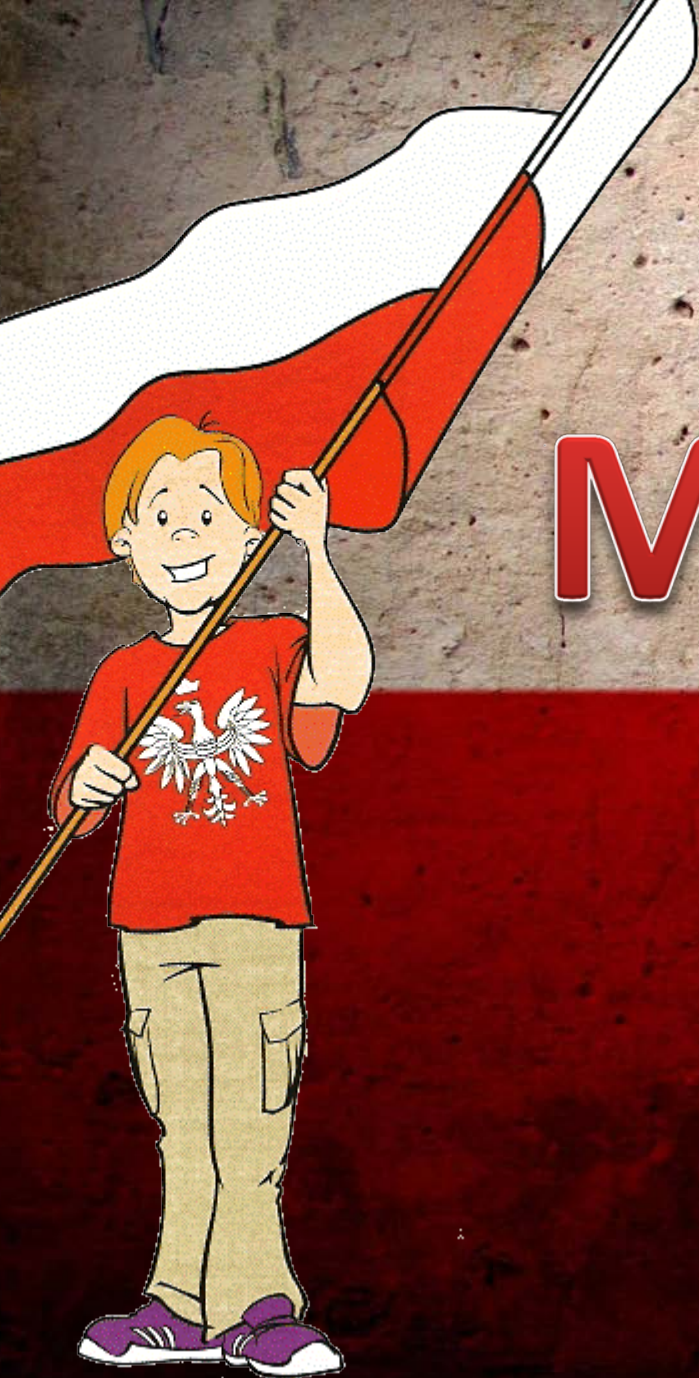
**1 August** - National Day of

# Meaning of date





- Holiday sets in tribute to the heroes of the Warsaw Uprising - to those who defend the statehood, in arms fought for the liberation of the capital, sought to restore the institutions of an independent Polish State, opposed the German occupation and the specter of Soviet captivity threatening the next generations of Poles. Reason attached to the bill lent further, that honors the day the uprising free Poland can repay his debt of gratitude.



# The establishment Of holidays





- Feast was established by the Act of 9 October 2009 on the establishment of the National Day of Remembrance of the Warsaw Uprising , adopted on the initiative of President Lech Kaczynski. For the adoption of a law voted **397** deputies , **1** was against , **6** abstentions. The Senate adopted the law without amendments on 5 November 2009. The Act was published in the Official Gazette on 7 December 2009 .
