

JAN OBLAK

Jan Oblak is a professional slovenian football player. He was born in Kranj 7th January 1993. He was growing up in Škofja Loka. He plays for Spanish club Atletico Madrid and he is in the Slovenias national team as a goalkeeper. He started playing football at the age of 5 for his home town club Ločan. At the age of 10 he moved to Olimpija

On 14th June 2010 Oblak signed a contract with S.L. Benfica. Portuguese club Benfica at the age of 17. After longtime incumbent Artur Moraes made some mistakes, manager Jorge Jesus put Oblak in the game, and the latter went on to keep several clean sheets in his first starts, notably in a 2–0 home win against F.C. Porto and a 0–0 draw at Juventus F.C. for the semi-finals of the UEFA Europa League. He eventually won the league's Best Goalkeeper of the Year award on 6 July 2014, only conceding three goals in 13 games.

On 16th July 2014, Atlético Madrid announced they had reached an agreement with Benfica for the transfer of Oblak. He then moved to Atlético Madrid for a fee of €16 million, becoming La Liga's most expensive goalkeeper of all time and 8. most expensive in football history

Oblak moved to Madrid on a six-year deal as a replacement for Thibaut Courtois, who had returned to play for his parent club Chelsea following his loan expiring. During his presentation, on 22 July, he said: "I don't come to replace anyone. I come as another player. I'm here along with the rest of the players and goalkeepers. I'll do everything in my power to defend this shirt and achieve great results this season. I will do everything in my hand to help the team".
